## True Sport Lives Here

*True Sport Lives Here* at Mooroondu means that we value integrity, respect, fun and responsibility. We want everyone to enjoy football and have a great experience, socially and competitively.

One of our club's values is **responsibility** – the buck stops with each of us individually. This includes:

- ◆ Each individual (parents and players) acting positively and taking responsibility for their actions, decisions and behaviour
- ◆ Taking appropriate steps to protect others from any form of harassment or abuse.

The following pages outline Codes of Behaviour. ALL PLAYERS, PARENTS & VISITORS must abide by these codes. **Disciplinary action** will be taken against anyone who is found to be in breach of these Codes of Behaviour. This may include:

- ◆ Taking immediate action to uphold the Codes of Behaviour and the spirit of the game,. For example, asking a player or parent to leave the field, or have time-out; directing people to comply with the relevant Policy or Code.
- ◆ Enforcing temporary suspensions from games or volunteer roles.
- ◆ Cancellation of club membership or permanent suspension from volunteer roles.

**IF YOU OBSERVE A BREACH OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT  
please follow the Complaints Policy**

## COMPLAINTS POLICY

- ◆ If you have any complaint, please talk to a Committee member immediately.
- ◆ If required, temporary action will be taken to address the problem immediately, following consultation with other Committee members.
- ◆ Further action will only be taken if the Complaint is received IN WRITING.
- ◆ All complaints received in writing, will be discussed at the next Committee meeting. If no written complaint is received, any temporary action taken will be cancelled, and no further action will be taken by the committee.



## Codes of Behaviour

### Players

- I will play by the rules.
- I will never argue with a referee.
- I will control my temper. I will not resort to verbal abuse, sledging, bullying or violence.
- I will work equally hard for myself and my team.
- I will cooperate with my coaches and team-mates.
- I will respect the decisions of my coach and the committee.
- I will be a good sport and applaud all good plays whether they are made by my team or the opposition.
- I will treat all participants as I would like to be treated. I will not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- I will participate for my own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please my parents and coaches.
- I will respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, culture or religion.

### Parents & Spectators

- I will take responsibility for my child and their behaviour, my own and my partner's behaviour, and the behaviour of any friends or relatives who attend my child's games or training.
- I will be responsible for ensuring my child abides by the above "Code of Behaviour – Players".
- I will respect and support all volunteers (coaches, managers, committee members, etc), referees, other players and parents and settle any disagreements according to the Complaints Policy without resorting to hostility, violence or verbal abuse. I will ensure any relatives or friends who attend my child's games or training will do the same.
- I will respect referees, coaches and the committee's decisions and ensure my child does the same.
- I will remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not mine.
- I will encourage my child to participate – I will not force them.
- I will focus on my child's efforts and performance rather than whether they win or lose.
- I will never ridicule or yell at my child, player, coach or official for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- I will respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, culture religion.



## Codes of Behaviour

### Coaches & Managers

- I will remember that young people participate for pleasure, and winning is only part of the fun.
- I will never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first.
- I will be reasonable in my demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- I will operate within the rules and spirit of the game and teach my players to do the same.
- I will ensure that the time players spend with me is a positive experience. All young people are deserving of equal attention and opportunities.
- I will ensure ALL PLAYERS are given equal playing time. I will avoid overplaying the talented players; every player is an equal member of the club and they need and deserve equal time.
- I will ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all players.
- I will display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators. I will encourage players to do the same.
- I will show concern and caution towards sick and injured players. I will follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.
- I will obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of young people.

### Policy—Smoking, Alcohol and Drugs

- Coaches, Managers, and any other person assisting in training or game activities will not consume alcohol during training or the game. In addition, no person will participate in training or game activities if they are in any way impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- Alcohol must only be consumed in licensed areas.
- All club coaches, managers and officials will present a good example to all young players in relation to the consumption of alcohol.
- NO SMOKING within the clubhouse or within 4 metres of any entrance to the clubhouse.
- NO SMOKING within 10 metres of any child, any field or training area when a match or training is being conducted, or the playground. Please be considerate of all club members & guests and move away if you wish to smoke.



## UNIFORMS & VOLUNTEER REBATE

### Uniforms

**All players MUST wear Mooroondu shorts and socks for games**  
**Shin pads and boots MUST be worn when training and playing**  
**All watches and jewellery must be removed for training and games**  
**(Joeys must wear shin-pads and closed in shoes)**

Uniforms will be available for sale at Sign-On, Muster Day and throughout the season—but please do not leave it till just before your game.

### Volunteer Rebate

At sign-on, each family was issued with a Volunteer Card. There are lots of jobs that need to be done each week—setting-up and packing-away; Grounds Officials; Game Leader; Referee; canteen; BBQ; raffles; fundraising activities; preparing fields for play and maintaining the grounds and clubhouse—and of course Coaching & Managing your team.

Once you've done your 5 hours (thank you!), please clearly fill in ALL the details and place it in the 'Match Fee' box. A cheque will be provided to your Team Manager (or posted directly to you).

## TRAINING

### Training

Each team has been allocated a training time and location—this time is listed on your Team Sheet which will be emailed to you after Muster Day. We have nearly 40 teams training at Mooroondu—space is limited. You must train only at your allocated time and location—if you would like to request a change, please contact a committee member.



Age groups will be training together. U6, U7 & U8 teams will have a Head Coach to assist with training programs.

### **FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN**

**For U6, U7, U8, U9 & U10 parents MUST meet the coach on the field or at the clubhouse before and after training**

**DO NOT drop your children in the carpark or expect them to go to the carpark on their own at the end of training—this is not safe.**

**For Juniors (U11 to U16), please make sure you get to know your coach and manager at training and discuss with them your drop-off and pick-up arrangements**

### Training Equipment

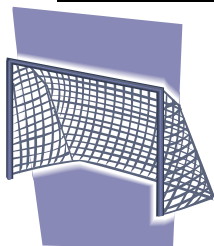
Each player will be provided with a correctly-sized football at Muster Day. Players should bring these balls to all training sessions.

Training kits (cones, coloured bibs) will be provided to all coaches. These **MUST** be returned, clean and in good condition at the end of the season.

Additional training equipment is available in the store room. Coaches will be provided with a key. Please return all equipment immediately after use.



## ON MATCH DAY



### Goal-Posts & Nets

First team on the field are responsible for putting up nets.  
Last team on the field are responsible for pulling down nets.

Rubbish bins need to be placed throughout the playing area by the first team; and returned to the clubhouse and emptied by the last team.

All of these jobs count towards the return of your Volunteer Levy.

All equipment is stored in the MFC Store Room—part of the change sheds behind the clubhouse (near the playground equipment).

U6, U7—light-weight fold-up goal-posts and pegs are provided.

U8, U9, U10—light-weight steel goal-posts are stored near the netball courts. Nets and pegs are provided in the store room.

All other ages—nets and pegs are provided in clearly marked wheelie-bins.

Ladders are provided, together with a number of hammers/mallets.

Please ensure all equipment is returned (including all the pegs, hammers and ladders) exactly as you found it. If any equipment is damaged or needs replacing, please contact a Committee member immediately.



### Fruit, Water & Rewards

At half-time, fruit (oranges, watermelon, etc) should be provided.  
A good way is to set-up a roster where each family takes a turn.

Every player should bring a water-bottle to the game. Drink caddies will be provided so that drinks can be kept together during the game.

As a special reward, some teams provide lollies or ice-blocks after the game—you can do this every week, or just when the team has worked hard. Please ensure all players are rewarded. Football is a team sport!

**NOTE:** Provision of fruit / lollies is not to be used for Volunteer hours.

For home games, Mooroondu has requested that all games are played on Friday nights or Saturdays—please be aware that this is not guaranteed, and that Away clubs may schedule Sunday games.

For Juniors (Under 11 to Under 16) and Womens the first three games will be Grading matches. These games will be used by Football Brisbane to confirm that teams have been placed in the correct Division.

### Wet Weather

Yes—you can still play football when it rains! The kids love it, the parents hate it! But we do not train or play when the fields or the weather present hazardous conditions.

## TEAM JERSEYS & SPONSORSHIP

### Jerseys

Each team is provided with a set of Playing Jerseys.



#### **JERSEYS MUST ONLY BE WORN DURING GAMES**

**Jerseys MUST be kept together throughout the season. One of the responsibilities of the Manager is to make sure all jerseys are returned in good condition at the end of the season.**

**Players CANNOT wear their jerseys home**

**The easiest way is to set-up a roster where each family takes a turn to wash the jerseys and return them for the next game (don't forget!)**

If you are playing at home against a team who also has red jerseys (you can check team colours at [www.footballbrisbane.com.au](http://www.footballbrisbane.com.au)), alternate strips are available in the clubhouse. Please check your fixtures and organize to get these during the week before the match. They must be returned immediately after washing.

**NOTE:** Washing of jerseys is not to be used for Volunteer hours—taking your turn to wash the jerseys is just part of being a team.

**PLEASE LOOK AFTER JERSEYS

### Sponsorship & Fundraising

The club endeavours to keep fees at a minimum to ensure that families are able to enjoy their football, without over-burdening them financially. We rely heavily on the hard work of our volunteers to help in fundraising and the support of local business through sponsorship.

Throughout the season, you will be asked to help with different fundraising activities—we try to use fun activities that build club spirit while raising much needed funds. Please help and support where you can.

## MATCH FEES & MATCH SHEETS

### Match Fees

**U6 to U16: \$5**

**Seniors & Over 35: \$10**

Match fees are collected from players at each game. This money is used to pay Referees, and to cover the weekly running expenses of the club (eg lights for training, line-marking, mowing, etc).

This money should be collected by the Manager. Any money remaining after paying referees should be placed in a labelled envelope (please complete all details) in the locked 'Match Fees' box in the clubhouse. Managers will be provided with envelopes, and some spares will be available on top of the pigeon-holes.



**Money for fruit or lollies is NOT to be taken from match fees. This is a small expense that should be shared fairly amongst all families.**



### Match Sheets

It is the responsibility of the Manager to complete the Match Sheet for each game. It is important that these are completed correctly each week.

**U6, U7, U8:** Please tear-out the yellow-copy (carefully) and leave it in the marked tray on top of the pigeon-holes.

**Juniors & Seniors:** The Match Sheet must be handed to the Referees at the Referees Room at least 15 minutes before the game. After the game, the Manager needs to go back and collect the signed Match Sheet, and provide a copy of your Match Sheet to the other team.

**The original (yellow copy) should be left at the home team's clubhouse.** At Mooroodu, please leave both teams yellow copies in the marked tray on top of the pigeon-holes. If you are away, and there is no-one to hand your original team sheet too, please return it to the Mooroodu clubhouse asap.

## REFEREES

Due to hygiene reasons we are unable to provide whistles—they are available for purchase at the canteen

### U6, U7, U8, U9 & U10 :

For games played at Mooroodu, we will be asking some of our Junior players, who have completed in-house club training, to act as Game Leader for U6, U7 and Instructing Referee for U8, U9 & U10 games. The role of this person is to control the game and keep it moving; instruct, correct and encourage all players; and ensure everyone is having fun!



### **Please Remember—they are just learning.**

Please support and encourage them, and provide them with positive feedback and constructive comments which will help them improve.

**Referee fees: \$10**—paid out of your match fees (home team to pay).

### **If no referee is available, teams are to provide their own.**

This should be a parent, friend, or supervised and capable teenager—just make sure you are familiar with the rules.

**Juniors & Seniors:** Match Officials (Referees & Assistant Referees) are allocated by Football Brisbane. For Over 35, Qld Masters Football provide a Referee only.

**If no referee is available, it is the home team's responsibility to provide a Referee—flags are available in the Refs room.** If one Assistant Referee is required, this should be provided by the home team; if two Assistant Referees are required, each team should provide an Assistant Referee.

Please look after the Match Officials who do come to Mooroodu. This is one of the key jobs of the Grounds Official.

**Juniors:** Referee fees are paid 50-50 by both teams at all games.

**Seniors:** Referee fees are paid in full by the home team.

**Over 35:** Referee fees are not paid by the team—the club is invoiced

### Fixture Results

Scores are not kept for U6 to U10 matches.

**Seniors:** Results must be entered into Results Vault within 18 hours of completion of the match. **The Club will be fined if this is not done.**

**Juniors:** Results must be entered into Results Vault within 48 hours of completion of the match.

Team Coaches and Managers will be provided with access to Results Vault.

## GROUND OFFICIALS

The role of the Ground Official is to ensure everything runs smoothly before, during and after the game. One of their most important jobs is to ensure that everyone adheres to the Codes of Behaviour.

Each field must be provided with a Grounds Official—this is the responsibility of the ‘Home’ team—so when you’re at Mooroondu, your team needs to do it—and it can not be the Coach or Manager. For U6, U7, and U8 matches, the ‘Home’ team is the team listed first on the fixtures list.



Please wear a Ground Official vest (available in the clubhouse) and don’t forget to return it when finished.

General duties of ALL Ground Officials:

- ◇ **Ensure that everyone follows the Codes of Behaviour.** This must be dealt with at the time, but please report any breaches to a Committee Member.
- ◇ **Help out in the event of an injury**—assist people with first-aid kits, call the ambulance, meet the ambulance on arrival, etc.
- ◇ **Provide support for Referees.** For U6 to U10 games, the Referee will be one of our junior players or club members. For Juniors & Seniors, the Referees will be appointed Match Officials or club members. **YOU MUST PROTECT THEM FROM ANY ABUSE FROM SPECTATORS.**
- ◇ **ASK FOR HELP**—we have lots of committee members this year, so please find one and ask for help if you’re not sure!

### U6, U7, U8, U9 & U10

- ◇ Make sure that a ball is available for the game.
- ◇ Make sure that at least one ball is available for the game.
- ◇ Introduce yourself to the Referee (one of our Junior players) and make sure they have everything they need.
- ◇ If there is no Referee, organize someone to Referee
- ◇ Provide support & assistance to the Ref—provide constructive feedback.

## GROUND OFFICIALS & INJURY



### Ground Officials

**Juniors & Seniors:** For these age groups, one of the key duties of the Ground Official is to look after the Refs:

- ◇ If you're the first game, check the Refs Room and make sure that it is open and clean.
- ◇ Introduce yourself to the Refs and make sure they have everything they need.
- ◇ Escort all Match Officials to and from the field before and after the game and at half-time. Look after the Refs Room key for them while they are on the Field.
- ◇ Organise free drinks and food from the canteen—water, softdrink or sports drink during or after each game; lunch or dinner if appropriate.
- ◇ Please meet with and hand-over to the next team's Ground Official before you leave.

### In the event of INJURY

Only registered Officials (Coaches / Managers / Committee Members) or the person wearing the Ground Officials jersey are allowed to enter the field in the event of an injury—and only once permission is given by the referee.



### PARENTS MUST NOT ENTER THE FIELD

(Officials are covered by Public Liability insurance through Football Queensland)

An *Accident or Injury Form* must be completed (see centre of handbook).

## JOEYS (3-5 year olds)

Mooroondu Joeys are our youngest club members and participate in the Football Queensland Squirts Program which provides fun activities for 3-5 year olds.

The focus is on fun, getting involved, and basic skill development. Joeys are not put into teams, nor do they play fixtures – although later in the season some sessions may involve a short “game”.

## U6 U7 U8 U9 U10 SMALL-SIDED FOOTBALL

### What is Small-Sided Football (SSF)?

Small-sided football (SSF) is a modified form of normal 11-a-side football. It is structured to address the needs of young players.

The philosophy of SSF focuses on enjoyment and freedom of expression with limited emphasis on coaching. The basis of SSF is that participants, playing on smaller fields and with small numbers, interact with the ball on more occasions and are required to make less complicated tactical decisions. The result is more fun and better skill/technique development.

In 2010, SSF will be implemented for U6, U7, U8, U9 and U10. Progressive implementation will occur in future years as these players move up the age groups. For more information:

## **JUNIORS—Under 11 to Under 16**

The Football Federation of Australia introduced some changes to the structure of the game for young players. While the publications discuss changes to the game up to U11—FFA are implementing this progressively. So, in 2010:

### **U11 will play according to previous years Junior Rules**

Competition rules are published each year by Football Brisbane in the 'Rules of Competition'. A copy of these rules is available on our web-site—please make sure you read them!

Juniors play according to full Football Rules, with a few exceptions which are outlined in the 'Rules of Competition'—please make sure you know and understand these rules.
